HARDIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES – APRIL 15, 2020 WEDNESDAY - 9:00 A.M. COURTHOUSE LARGE CONFERENCE ROOM

Chair Lance Granzow called the meeting to order. The meeting was held electronically due to COVID-19 public health risks. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the agenda as posted. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the minutes of April 8, 2020. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the April 15, 2020 claims for payment. Motion carried.

Utility Permits: None.

Taylor Roll, County Engineer, received a request for a speed limit change in Alden which will need to be addressed by the City. He also received a request for an engine brake ordinance at S56 and D15 south of Ackley. A work session will be held to discuss a possible ordinance.

At 9:09 a.m. the Chair opened the public hearing on proposed street and alley vacations in Cleves. Taylor Roll, County Engineer, reviewed the proposed street and alley vacations. Written comments were received in support of the vacations. Lonny Beving also commented. There being no other comments or objections, McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to close the public hearing. <u>WHEREAS</u>, A public hearing was conducted on April 15th, 2020 following publication and service of notice as required by law on the proposed vacation and closure of a portion of street in Cleves, Iowa, described as follows:

A Sixteen-foot-wide alley lying southerly of the adjacent to lots 14, Block 1, located in Kings Addition, in the unincorporated town of Cleves, Iowa.

A Sixteen-foot-wide alley lying northernly of the adjacent to lots 1 through 8, Block 2, located in Bunjer's Addition, in the unincorporated town of Cleves, Iowa

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the 2020 Child Abuse Prevention Month Proclamation. Roll Call Vote: "Ayes" McClellan, Hoffman, and Granzow. "Nays" None. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the Employment Statement of Understanding – Central Iowa Community Services. Motion carried.

Public Comments:

Doug Morse, Hansen Family Hospital, briefed the Board on hospital operations in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and lauded the collaborative efforts taking place throughout the county. A financial update was also provided.

Carrie Kube thanked the Board for signing the Child Abuse Prevention Month Proclamation and its support year-round.

Julie Duhn asked Sheriff Dave McDaniel about ICE detainee movement in and out of the jail.

Other Business:

County Treasurer Machel Eichmeier reminded property owners they have until April 30 to pay taxes without penalty. She added that owners should try to pay before the third Monday of June to avoid tax sale.

Donna Juber thanked Eichmeier for her office's quick service.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

At 10:45 a.m. the meeting reconvened for a work session with IGHCP. The meeting was held electronically due to COVID-19 public health risks. In attendance: Supervisors Granzow, Hoffman, and McClellan; Denise Ballard and Cindy Allen, IGHCP; Michael Pearce; Becca Junker; and Angela Silvey.

Following a clarification on VSP benefits, McClellan moved, Granzow seconded to retract McClellan's motion from 4/15/2020 to go to VSP Plan B for the County's vision benefit. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to remain with the County's current Avesis vision plan. Motion carried.

VOYA and Lincoln Financial life insurance policies were compared. Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve offering Lincoln Financial life insurance effective 07/01/2020. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the open enrollment process for all insureds on the County's plan. During discussion, Denise Ballard recommended an amendment to the health plan 28E stating that, relative to health benefits, the participants in the 28E will receive the same benefits at the same premiums as set by the Supervisors. Also discussed was whether or not tobacco and nontobacco rates could be required of other entities.

It was decided to start open enrollment the week of April 20, 2020, with paperwork due May 15.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to authorize Becca Junker, Payroll and Benefits Manager, to work directly with IGHCP for employee insurance benefits and for those entities covered under the County's insurance plan.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to adjourn at 11:28 a.m. Motion carried.

- D. The applicant shall use reference markers in the right-of-way (ROW) boundary to locate line and changes in alignment as required by the County Engineer. A permanent warning tape shall be placed one (1) foot above all underground utility lines.
- E. All tile line locations shall be marked with references located in the ROW line.
- F. No underground utility lines shall cross over a crossroad drainage structure without approval from the County Engineer.
- G. Residents along the utility route shall have uninterrupted access to the public roads. An all weather access shall be maintained for residents adjacent to the project.
- H. After construction, granular surfacing shall be added to the road by the applicant to restore the road to its original condition. After surfacing has been applied, the road surface shall be reviewed by the County Engineer once the road has been saturated, to determine if additional surfacing on the roadway by the applicant is necessary.
- All damaged areas within the ROW shall be repaired and restored to at least their former condition by the
 applicant or the cost of any repair work caused to be performed by the county will be assessed against
 the applicant.
- J. Areas disturbed during construction which present an erosion problem shall be solved by the applicant in a manner approved by the County Engineer.
- K. All trenches, excavations, and utilities that are knifed shall be properly tamped.
- L. All utilities shall be located between the bottom of the backslope and the bottom of the foreslope, unless otherwise approved in writing by the County Engineer prior to installation.
- M. Road crossing shall be bored. The depth below the road surface shall match the minimum depth of cover for the respective utility.

6. NON-CONFORMING WORK

The County Engineer may halt the installation at any time if the applicant's work does not meet the requirements set forth in this Utility Permit Application.

7. COUNTY INFRACTION

Violation of this permit is a county infraction under lowa Code Section 331.307, punishable by a civil penalty of \$100 for each violation. Each day that a violation occurs or is permitted to exist by the applicant constitutes a separate offense.

8. HOLD HARMLESS

The utility company shall save this county harmless of any damages resulting from the applicant's operations. A copy of a certificate of insurance naming this county as an additional insured for the permit work shall be filed in the County Engineer's Office prior to installation. The minimum limits of liability under the insurance policy shall be \$1,000,000.

9. PERMIT REQUIRED

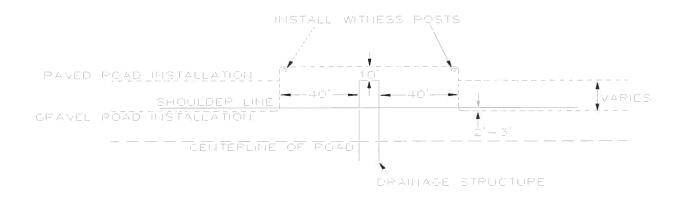
No applicant shall install any lines unless such applicant has obtained a Utility Permit from the County Engineer and has agreed in writing that said installation will comply with all ordinances and requirements of the county for such work. Applicants agree to hold the county free from liability for all damage to applicant's property which occurs proximately as a result of the applicant's failure to comply with said ordinances or requirements.

10 RELOCATION

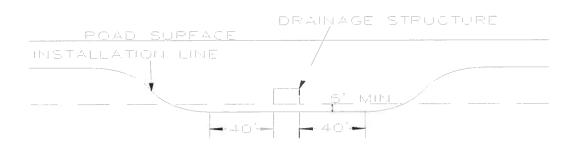
The applicant shall, at any time subsequent to installation of utility lines, at the applicant's own expense, relocate or remove such lines as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment or widening of ROW resulting from maintenance or construction operations for highway improvements.

9. PERMIT REQUIRED

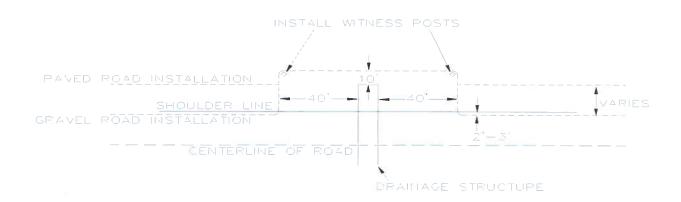

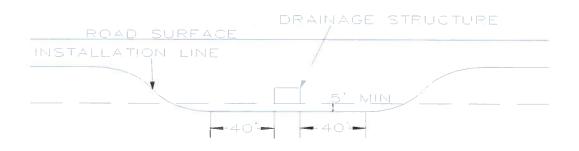

While spraying weeds some vines/ large parsnip patches/small brush/ trees (up to 3 feet) were sprayed.

Brush:

Brush spraying operations were performed sporadically.

Products using: (Vastlan/Escort/ Spreader on (surfactant)/ Reign (drift Control)

Brush Mowing:

Brush mowed (2018) Roughly 135 linear miles reaching for-slop, bottom and backslope.

Brush Mowed (March 2019-End of Year) Roughly 300 linear miles reaching foreslope, bottom and backslope.

Chain-sawing:

Manually cut roughly 668 (centerline miles) Chipping what would fit through the chipper. Left trees under 9ft to be sprayed with herbicide.

Noxious Weed Complaints (weed Commissioner duties):

Received 11 noxious weed complaints, sent out 11 certified letters. Upon follow up, areas were mowed or sprayed. One exception was in the town of Eldora, after talking to the city, they were going to take care of the complaint.

Brush Complaints:

Received 5 work orders for brush complaints, took care of the ones that didn't require a bucket truck.

Weed Complaints:

Received 3 weed complaints and took care of them as they came in.

Other:

Preformed routine maintenance on all equipment as needed or on rain-days went through and cleaned equipment. Power washed equipment daily/weekly depending on the piece of equipment.

Background

Hardin County Economic Development (ED) is a new department within Hardin County, governed in partnership with a new nonprofit economic development organization, the Hardin County Economic Development Advisory Council. The entity was formed to lead economic development activities for the city and county areas not served by Iowa Falls Area Development, and to support Iowa Falls Area Development's activities in a coordinated effort to provide economic growth and resilience across Hardin County. To clearly define the entity's role and activities within economic development, the County Board of Supervisors and Advisory Council Members determined that a strategic planning process was needed to provide structure for leadership and staff.

Working with the Institute for Decision Making at the University of Northern Iowa, Hardin County ED engaged its Supervisors, Advisory Council members, and other community stakeholders to understand the priorities for economic development within the county and to develop a Hardin County Economic Development Strategic Plan. The planning process involved stakeholder input collected via a preplanning questionnaire followed by planning sessions with a planning team consisting of the Hardin County board of supervisors, the Hardin County ED advisory council, economic development partners, and staff. The planning team considered the stakeholder input and a data-driven situational analysis to determine and refine economic development priority areas of activity, goals, strategies and action plans to be pursued over the next few years.

Business Retention and Expansion (BR&E) Committee: Assists with and ensures a robust BR&E program that serves existing businesses.

Business Attraction Committee: Charged with business recruitment assistance and product development and marketing.

Workforce & Talent Development Committee: Coordinates and promotes talent attraction and retention efforts and organizes workforce development activities in collaboration with community partners.
