HARDIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES – JULY 13, 2022 WEDNESDAY – 9:00 A.M. COURTHOUSE LARGE CONFERENCE ROOM

Board Chair BJ Hoffman called the meeting to order. Supervisors Lance Granzow and Renee McClellan were present. Also in attendance: Darrell Meyer, Taylor Roll Angela De La Riva, Michael Pearce, Jolene Pieters, Brian Ritland, and Collin Swenson. Attending via Zoom: Connie Mesch, Cheryl Lawrence, JD Holmes, Thomas Craighton, Tanner Lascheid, Rocky Reents, Elaine Loring, Curt Groen, Donna Juber, Lisa Lawler, Pauline Lloyd, Mark Buschkamp, and Julie Duhn.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

McClellan moved, Granzow seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded to approve the minutes from July 6, 2022. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Granzow seconded to approve the claims for payment for July 13, 2022. Motion carried.

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded to acknowledge the animal feeding operation construction permit application for the Hardin Buckeye 3 Site, Section 3, Buckeye Township be sent to the DNR. Motion carried.

At 9:03 a.m. the Public Hearing on County Property for Sale was opened.

No public comments were received prior to the Public Hearing by the Auditor's office via email or phone.

Attorney Meyer will write up a resolution to convey Reumpers Trail property to the city of Radcliffe.

Sealed bids were opened by the Board of Supervisors as follows: \$6,500 per acre-Summit Agricultural Group with pre-approval of financing. \$6,500 per acre-Dean Bright with a letter of credit from his bank, \$6,510 per acre-Polly Granzow. All 3 bids were qualified bids. No bids were received for the Round Barn. Options for the Round Barn were discussed.

No public comments were received during the Public Hearing.

The live auction will proceed at 11:00 a.m. for the County Home Land between the 3 qualified bidders. Bids were be received for price per acre. Final price will be determined after the land survey.

RESOLUTION 2022-18 RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2010-25 MEAL REIMBURSEMENT

WHEREAS, the Hardin County Board of Supervisors adopted on or about June 16, 2010, Resolution 2010-25 Meal Reimbursement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Hardin County hereby amends Resolution No. 2010-25, to include the attached provisions:

MEAL REIMBURSEMENT

The county will reimburse employees for meals needed while attending an approved educational training session outside the County. Reimbursement will be made for actual meal expenditures excluding alcoholic beverages, subject to the following guidelines:

Daily Meal Reimbursement \$50.00

The above are guidelines, with the Daily Maximum meal reimbursement not to exceed \$50.00. Receipts for all meals must be provided. Meals during the normal course of performing an employee's job will not be reimbursed. Reimbursement for meals when the employee in NOT in overnight status will be reported as taxable income in the next pay period and is subject to federal and state income tax withholding and Social Security Tax payments. Persons filing for meals reported for taxable income may only include their own individual meals, not those of other people. All application Internal Revenue Service regulations regarding reports of reimbursed expenses will be followed by the Auditor's office.

The County Engineer may provide a full-time inspector during the installation of all lines to ensure compliance with this Utility Permit. The inspector shall have the right, during reasonable hours and after showing proper identification, to enter any installation site in the discharge of the inspector's official duties, and to make any inspection or test that is reasonably necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

4. INSPECTION FEES

The applicant shall pay actual costs directly attributable to the installation inspection conducted by the County Engineer. Within thirty (30) days after completion of the installation, the County Engineer shall submit a statement for inspection services rendered. The applicant agrees to reimburse the county within thirty (30) days of billing.

5. REQUIREMENTS

The installation inspector shall assure that the following requirements have been met:

- H. After construction, granular surfacing shall be added to the road by the applicant to restore the road to its original condition. After surfacing has been applied, the road surface shall be reviewed by the County Engineer once the road has been saturated, to determine if additional surfacing on the roadway by the applicant is necessary.
- All damaged areas within the ROW shall be repaired and restored to at least their former condition by the
 applicant or the cost of any repair work caused to be performed by the county will be assessed against

- J. Areas disturbed during construction which present an erosion problem shall be solved by the applicant in a manner approved by the County Engineer.
- K. All trenches, excavations, and utilities that are knifed shall be properly tamped.

- M. Road crossing shall be bored. The depth below the road surface shall match the minimum depth of cover for the respective utility.

7. COUNTY INFRACTION


