### DRAINAGE DISTRICT 167 LANDOWNER MEETING

7/25/2018 - Minutes

### 1. Open Meeting

Hardin County Board of Supervisors Co-Chairperson, Renee McClellan, opened the meeting. Also present was Supervisor, Lance Granzow; Landowners, Michael Martin, Neil Martin, Lydia Martin, Curt Groen, Dave Bernard, Jim Martin, Larry Balvanz, Ron Reece and Pauline Lloyd; Lee Gallentine with Clapsaddle-Garber Associates (CGA); Drainage Clerk, Tina Schlemme. Absent: Supervisor, BJ Hoffman.

### 2. Approve Agenda

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded to approve the agenda as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

### 3. Attendance/Introductions

Introductions were made and attendance verified.

### 4. Explanation Of Project

The meeting was turned over to Gallentine who explained the repair summary. An investigation began when a landowner in the NE SE of Section 4-86-20 reported a blowout in the waterway with smaller ones upstream. It is evident that the tile is blocked and needs repaired. It is currently 6 to 8 inch tile but due to low soil cover, it is recommended that it be replaced with concrete pipe which comes in 12 inch pipe. Gallentine further stated that multiple repairs have been submitted over the past 20 years.

### 5. Comments/Discussion

Granzow asked the landowners if they would like to replace the main tile as is, replace both main tiles into one larger tile or just perform spot repairs. Neil Martin stated he had helped as a boy installing the original tile in the mid 1940's and believed the soil cover to be 4 feet. Gallentine added that the spot they checked the cover was only 1.5 to 2 feet of cover so erosion must have occurred. There was much discussion between land owners regarding replacing all of the tile moving forward. It was agreed that they would pay to have an engineer's report created to see the projected estimated costs with the different options to see how they would like to move forward. When asked if they would consider an open ditch option, Neil Martin stated he would like to keep the drainage underground. Gallentine added that they are busy with construction season right now, but he would hope to have a report completed by the end of the year.

### 6. Possible Action

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded for CGA to complete an engineer's report with both repair and improvement options and a hearing will be scheduled once submitted. It was discussed that the repair option should include a single line repair and both lines being replaced into one tile. All ayes. Motion carried.

### 7. Other Business

It was discussed that a reclassification may be considered once the engineer's report is submitted and a plan is approved.

### 8. Adjourn Meeting

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded to adjourn the meeting. All ayes. Motion carried.

Gallentine explained that the tile was plugged with Austree roots. At four of the holes, they found 12" non-perf tile at least 1/2 plugged with roots. They were able to remove the roots. At the fifth hole, the tile was completely plugged with roots and were coming in through the wall of the non-perf tile. Roots could not be removed without damaging the tile, so approximately 65 feet of tile was removed. Currently the tile is flowing but with 65 feet open. CGA recommends removing the Austrees and replacing the 65 feet of tile. Because these are outside the 50 foot right of way, they suggest seeking legal opinion. Granzow moved, McClellan seconded for Schlemme to email Attorney, Mike Richards, to obtain legal opinion on options for tree removal. Richards should contact Gallentine for specifics if needed. All ayes. Motion carried.

- 7. DD 95 Discuss, With Possible Action, Repair Summary For Work Order #162 Gallentine presented the repair summary which recommends that the remainder of the Lateral 3 tile be monitored for signs of tile failure or restricted drainage. The main tile should be repaired at the blowout to prevent soil loss and prevent drainage restrictions if the collapsed area expands. The Trustees agreed that they will leave the repairs and let the landowner farm around them, per the landowner request, until another issue is brought to the Trustees attention.
- 8. DD 148 Discuss, With Possible Action, Repair Summary For Work Order #211
  Gallentine updated the Trustees that the intake was originally installed by the district and is their responsibility to replace. To replace with the current concrete style, it would cost under \$6,000, but a Hickenbottom style would be less than \$3,000. Granzow moved, McClellan seconded for Gallentine to ask the landowner which intake they prefer of the two options and install it. All ayes. Motion carried.
- 9. DD 77 Discuss, With Possible Action, Updates Regarding Current Project It was discussed that the landowner of the repair area has requested a full replacement of the tile to gain extra depth. The contractor on site, Hands On, has agreed to install up to the 1,000 feet of tile with crushing the existing in place, salvaging 100 feet of the previously repaired tile and offsetting the new tile in a new trench for under \$50,000. Granzow moved, McClellan seconded for Gallentine to draft a change order for the additional length of repair under \$50,000. All ayes. Motion carried.

8/1/2018 - Minutes

### 1. Open Meeting

Hardin County Board of Supervisors Chairman, BJ Hoffman, opened the meeting. Also present were Supervisors, Lance Granzow and Renee McClellan; Landowners, Denny Harris, Betty Harris, Paul Peterson, Donald Peterson, Randy Madden, Lee Anderson, Di Stoffregen and John Liittschwager; Heather Thomas with Clapsaddle-Garber Associates (CGA); Drainage Clerk, Tina Schlemme.

### 2. Approve Agenda

McClellan moved, Granzow seconded to approve the agenda as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

### 3. Discuss Project Materials As Bid

The meeting was turned over to Thomas who explained that there were three bidders from the previous weeks letting. No matter what options are chosen, Gehrke is the low bidder. After discussion, landowners agreed that the base bid of polypropylene was off the table as concrete was the preferred method and it was the cheaper option. After questioned, Thomas stated the perforated concrete meant that the joints would be wrapped so they are soil tight but not water tight. Thomas assured landowners that there would be an observer on site at all times and there would be periodic compaction testing and surveyors on site for grading. Thomas added that the specs state the contractor can start in either the fall or spring but they can only disturb one season of crops. Gehrkes had stated to Thomas that they would like to start this fall though. Paul Peterson questioned how the private connections would be installed, in which Thomas assured they would be industry standards.

Much discussion took place regarding the need for rock bedding. Thomas stated that a waiver would need signed if they did not install rock bedding. She further explained that due to the soil types, the industry standards are to install it with rock bedding. Madden stated he had spoken with a top pipe supplier and they told him they wouldn't require rock bedding. Madden continued to state that he did not like the engineer's approach on this requirement and questioned if this would be their stance on future county projects. He cautioned the Trustees using CGA as it could be costly for landowners. Madden and Paul Peterson both stated they would like the Trustees to shop around for other engineering firms on their requirements and to keep everyone honest. Madden also asked if no rock bedding could be used on the lower, more shallow end of the project. The Trustees agreed that Matt Garber with CGA should attend the next meeting to discuss these requirements and see if a change order reducing the project would be possible.

When asked, the majority of landowners chose the alt concrete bid with rock bedding, no televising to occur, the concrete with rock bedding cross connection and the 2 year maintenance bond. The Trustees agreed that Schlemme should research the industry standards for bedding material on concrete pipe installations and to agenda the discussion with Matt Garber for the next meeting. Schlemme displayed estimated assessments and costs with the chosen options.

### 4. Award Bid

McClellan moved, Granzow seconded to award the bid to Gehrke Inc for the RCP alt bid with rock bedding and add alts #4 (concrete with rock bedding cross connection) and #6 (two year maintenance bond) and to discuss the possible change order reduction at the next meeting. Roll Call-McClellan, aye. Granzow, aye. Hoffman, aye. Motion carried.

Granzow moved, McClellan seconded to adjourn the meeting. All ayes. Motion carried.





### Repair Summary:

- Tenant reported a plugged Lateral 3 tile located in the NE¼ of Section 33, Township 87 North, Range 21 West with water coming out of intake and flowing overland.
- Visually inspected area and found water coming out of intake. Water was running on the surface along the approximate path of the Lateral 3 tile to the next intake downstream and then flowing into said downstream intake.
- Excavated five holes using as-built GPS shots from 2011 tile replacement.
- At first four holes, found 12" single wall non-perforated HDPE Lateral 3 tile at least ½ plugged with tree roots from Austrees at building site to the north. Removed tree roots from said locations and left the tile in place.
- At the fifth hole, said tile was totally plugged with Austree roots that were coming through the wall of the tile. Roots could not be removed with damaging the tile. Therefore, removed 65'± of HDPE tile at the fifth hole's location.
- After removal, left excavation open so that tile could flow.

### Contractor Time and Materials (spent while CGA was on-site):

See attached Tabulated Contractor Time and Materials Sheet.

### Additional Actions Recommended:

The above is a temporary fix at best. Therefore, I would recommend the following permanent repairs:

- The tile was already relocated farther away from the Austrees 7 years ago and even though non-perforated tile was used, the Austrees still penetrated the wall of the tile. Therefore, I see no alternative besides removing all the Austrees at the building site to the north and treat any stumps to prevent regrowth.
- After this is done, the 65'± of Lateral 3 tile that was removed can be replaced.

It is my understanding of Iowa Code that the District Trustees have the right to remove the Austrees, but I would recommend that they seek a legal opinion of how to correctly do it. It is also my opinion that the total construction cost to do this would be \$15,000 or less. The cost is low enough that neither a hearing nor an engineer's report would be required for this work.




