HARDIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES – NOVEMBER 10, 2020 TUESDAY - 9:00 A.M. COURTHOUSE LARGE CONFERENCE ROOM

Chair Lance Granzow called the meeting to order. The meeting was held electronically due to COVID-19 public health risks. Also in attendance were Supervisors BJ Hoffman and Reneé McClellan; and Connie Mesch, Tifani Eisentrager, JD Holmes, Becca Junker, Chris Wieting, Justin Ites, Wes Wiese, Abby Flatness, Lori Kadner, Angela De La Riva, Dave McDaniel, Donna Juber, Bob Juber, Lisa Lawler, Julie Duhn, Jamie Geisler, Denise Smith, Taylor Roll, Michael Pearce, Carey Callaway, Jessica Sheridan, Thomas Craighton, and Angela Silvey.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the agenda as posted. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the minutes of September 28, 2020; October 21, 2020; and October 28, 2020. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the November 10, 2020 claims for payment. Motion carried.

Utility Permits: None.

Secondary Roads: County Engineer Taylor Roll briefed the Board on the County Auction. Proceeds totaled \$9,051.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the 2020 Weed Commissioner's Report. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the Iowa DOT Federal-Aid Agreement for a(n) Iowa Transportation Alternatives Program, Federal Recreational Trails Program Project, and State Recreational Trails Program Project, Agreement No. 2021-TAP-143 - Iowa River's Edge Trail. Roll Call Vote: "Ayes" McClellan, Hoffman, and Granzow. "Nays" None. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the Iowa DOT Federal-Aid Agreement for a(n) Iowa Transportation Alternatives Program Project and Federal Recreational Trails Program Project, Agreement No. 2021-NRT-004 - Iowa River's Edge Trail. Roll Call Vote: "Ayes" McClellan, Hoffman, and Granzow. "Nays" None. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the tax abatements as presented in Order Nos. 5918, 5919, 5920, 5921, 5922, 5923, 5924, 5925 and 5926. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to accept the resignation of Adam Seward from the County Conservation Board, effective 11/01/2020. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to appoint Patty Hammer to fill the vacancy on the Conservation Board created by Seward's resignation. Hammer's term ends 12/31/2024. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the Auditor's Monthly Report for October 2020. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the Recorder's Monthly Report for October 2020. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the Sheriff's Monthly Report for October 2020. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve Jamie Geisler as authorized speaker and officer for management of county credit cards. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to remove Mindy McLeland as authorized speaker and officer for management of County credit cards. Motion carried.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the hiring of Andrew Jeske, Secondary Roads Truck Driver, at a rate of \$21.50/hour, effective 11/16/2020. Jeske is eligible for a 25 cent pay raise after a six-month probationary period. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to approve the administrative Change of Status for Jordyn Houston, part-time Dispatcher, at a rate of \$16.48/hour, effective 08/01/2020. The change was submitted to correct a classification for payroll purposes. Motion carried.

Emergency Management Update:

Emergency Management Coordinator Thomas Craighton reported on COVID-19 trends and that the County's request for \$213,573.31 in CARES Act money was approved.

Public Comments:

Donna Juber commented on the Board's silence regarding masks.

Carey Callaway thanked everyone who helped make the General Election run smoothly.

Julie Duhn requested the Board issue a mask requirement.

Other Business: None.

McClellan moved, Hoffman seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

At 10:00 a.m. the Board met for a work session regarding budget amendments for FY 2020/2021. The meeting was held electronically due to COVID-19 public health risks. In attendance: Supervisors Granzow, Hoffman, and McClellan; and Julie Duhn, Donna Juber, Bob Juber, Michael Pearce, Taylor Nederhoff, and Angela Silvey.

Discussion was held on whether or not the Supervisors, as a department, needed to submit any budget amendments to Auditor Jessica Lara in advance of the December 9, 2020 budget hearing. It was determined the Supervisors have no budget amendments at this time.

At 10:08 a.m. Hoffman moved, McClellan seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m. the Board met with attorney Taylor Nederhoff regarding a property tax adjustment. The meeting was held electronically due to COVID-19 public health risks. In attendance: Supervisors Granzow, Hoffman, and McClellan; and Julie Duhn, Nederhoff, Michael Pearce, and Angela Silvey.

Nederhoff, representing Ellsworth Neighborhood Investment Group, requested an abatement of taxes on Parcel 892018159026 due to taxes being assessed on building that was demolished. Specifically, he requested an abatement of unpaid taxes due March 2020 and waiver of penalty.

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held at 9:02 A.M. on the 18th day of November, 2020 in the Conference Room of the Hardin County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, there being no objections to the vacating of part of the Hardin County road right-of-way as advertised; and

WHEREAS, there being no claim for damages.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Hardin County Board of Supervisors that the subject section be ordered vacated and closed and denies any and all claims for damages.

Hardin County Quit Claims its interest to the following property owner:

Elaine J. Frerichs - An easement being a part of an existing road right of way easement of 170th Street located in the Fractional West One-half (FrW ¹/₂) and the West Five Rods (W. 5 Rods) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¹/₄) all in Section Seven (7), Township Eighty-eight (88) North, Range Nineteen (19) West of the 5th P.M., Hardin County, Iowa, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the West Quarter (W ¹/₄) Corner of said Section 7; thence South 89°37'53" East, 924.16 feet along the existing centerline of 170th Street to an intersection of said centerline with a line offset 66.00 feet Southerly from the north line of the Hardin County Frerichs Easement Project (said intersection being the point of beginning); thence North 82°23'00" East, 1467.16 feet along a line parallel and 66.00 feet offset Southerly from said north line; thence South 87°48'58" East, 96.53 feet along said parallel line to a point on the east line of said West Five Rods (said point also being a point on a curve on the southern existing right of way line of said 170th Street); thence southwesterly 350.25 feet on said southern right of way line along an 883.73 feet radius curve, concave Southeasterly, having a central angle of 22°42'29" to a corner thereof; thence South 69°03'20" West, 99.16 feet along said southern right of way line to a corner thereof; thence Southwesterly 179.67 feet on said southern right of way line along a 707.69 feet radius curve, concave Northwesterly, having a central angle of 14°32'47" to a corner thereof; thence South 83°36'07" West, 798.98 feet along said southern right of way line to a corner thereof; thence North 89°37'53" West, 382.32 feet along said southern right of way line to the intersection of said southern right of way line and with said parallel line; thence North 82°23'00" East, 237.55 feet along said parallel line; thence North 82°23'00" East, 237.55 feet along said parallel line to the point of beginning, containing 1.78 acres total. Subject to easements.

For the purpose of this survey, the south line of the Fractional Northwest Quarter (FrNW ¹/₄) was determined to bear South 89°33'15" East using GPS.

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2020-15

WHEREAS, the Hardin County Board of Supervisors adopted on or about April 1, 2020, an Infectious Disease Action Plan, Resolution 2020-15; and

WHEREAS, the Hardin County Board of Supervisors adopted on August 12, 2020, a policy regulating entry by county employees and the public to the County Courthouse, County Office Building and County Jail/Sheriff Office; and

WHEREAS, the Hardin County Board of Health adopted on or about August 27, 2020, a recommendation that face coverings be worn by all in public; and

WHEREAS, the Hardin County Board of Supervisors remains actively involved in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and is committed to protecting the health of Hardin County employees and the public; and,

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, the Hardin County Public Health Department and the Governor of the State of Iowa recommend face coverings to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Hardin County encourages political subdivisions and private businesses throughout Hardin County to explore similar measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and help keep businesses operational; and

AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION NO. 2020-15

All Hardin County employees when not at their respective workstation shall always wear face coverings (defined by the Hardin County Board of Health as "a material that securely covers a person's nose and mouth and remains affixed in place without the use of one's hands, whether purchased or homemade, and consistent with CDC guidelines"). If an employee is not medically able to wear face covering such as a mask, then a face shield that meets CDC guidelines may be worn. It will be the employee's burden to demonstrate a medical inability to wear a face covering such as a mask. All employees will limit contact with multiple people in a workspace. This includes regular workstations, break rooms and other collective spaces.

The county building entry policy adopted on August 12, 2020, as amended, is incorporated herein by the reference.

Face coverings are required of visitors to all county owned buildings in addition to any other policies in effect.

Employees are encouraged to wear facial covering outside of work environment while in public.

Employees experiencing any symptoms described in Resolution No. 2020-15 shall report it immediately. Employees shall call their supervisor to report these conditions. The Supervisor/Department Head shall relay this information to the County Auditor's Office immediately.
